Director's Report - Justin Blasko

Enrollment and Lottery Update - Dr. Blasko reported that 1094 students are currently enrolled. In the 2024-25 school year there are 1181 students enrolled with 98 students on the waiting list. The target for the next school year is 1122.

Academic Progress - RISE Assessments begin next week. The school will be hosting a summer school this year. Vista is looking to expand its 95% program.

Faculty/Staff Changes - The school has hired several new teachers for the upcoming school year. Carolina Miller, the school's attendance administrative assistant, will be leaving in May. Abe Nickle will be leaving to pursue a new career which has started a change in the MDT program. Lacey Williams will be replacing him as the choir teacher. Barry Burr, Hailey Rowe, Sue Eyring, and Lindsey Stalling will be leaving at the end of the year.

Upcoming and Past Events - The Advanced Orchestra performed at the SUPAF awards ceremony. The spring dance concert, with kindergarten to 9th graders, was last week. VCE's SAINT Contemporary Ballet (9th-12th grade) will be performing a ballet version of Alice in Wonderland this weekend.

6:40 PM Financial Report - Troy Bradshaw reported on this month's profit and loss. There will be upcoming spending on further safety measures that will be discussed in future closed sessions.

6:56 PM Committee Reports (Finance, Audit, Governance) Michelle Walter shared some legislative updates from a meeting the night prior, including bonuses for the top 25% of teachers, safety mandates including a required school resource officer, and funding. # **Appeal Process for 7th Grade Human Development Curriculum**

Any parent or guardian whose student is enrolled in 7th grade Health Education at Vista School may request an appeal of the curriculum used in the state mandated Human Development program.

Upon receipt of the formal written request form for the appeal of curriculum for Human Development, Vista School's Director shall convene a committee to review the request for resolution. The committee will consist of the following:

At least one parent from the existing **Health Curriculum Approval Committee**Health Teacher
School Nurse
School Administrator

The stakeholder submitting the appeal for the curriculum, and all teachers, parents and staff members who have served on the committee shall receive written notice of the decision within 15 days after convening.

If a satisfactory agreement can not be reached after consideration by the committee, the information shall be forwarded to Vista's Director for a final decision.
